In preparation of the new funding period from 2021 on we will continue dialogue with different DGs to talk about the proposed funding programs Horizon Europe and Digital Europe as well as European initiatives to facilitate the participation of our regional stakeholders.

## **ACTIVITIES**

### **Digitising Cultural Heritage**

**26 March 2020, 9:45-12:00**

Joint meeting with Tourism and Cultural Heritage WG on the digitalisation of cultural heritage. The aim is to explore European Initiatives, networks and funding programs that can be connected to digitalisation and cultural heritage. This meeting will include a presentation of Time Machine project which aims to develop distributed digital information system mapping the European social, cultural and geographical evolution across times. A presentation of Time Machine project will take place which gives regional stakeholders, also cities, the opportunity to engage in several ways:

- connect to know how and methods that are developed to enhance the digitalisation of data from the past
- hear about the possibilities of “local Time machines”
- reflect on how to make use of the open data that is generated by “Time machine” for innovative (business) applications

Also, some local time machines will be presented and discussed. A presentation by the European Commission (three different DGs) on the opportunities and synergies in cultural heritage and digitisation will follow.

### **Telemedicine**

The meeting will focus on telemedicine and modernising community care with regards to rural areas and will be organised jointly with Health WG.

### **Implementing the Green Deal via ICT and digital infrastructures**

**June**

The aim of this meeting is to explore how can regions and their digitalisation projects help develop the aims of the Green Deal. We will also focus on how the regions are implementing the Green Deal policies and sustainable development goals in relation to EU Digital Policy. The examples will refer to Green ICT with contribution from Energy WG.
