

CLUSTER DESCRIPTION AND KEY PRIORITIES

ERRIN's Strategic Cluster combines the activities of the Policy Working Group, Science & Education for Society Working Group and Smart Specialisation Working Group, aligning their efforts to address key EU priorities and strengthen the R&I capacities of the regional innovation ecosystems of the ERRIN members. Operating as a Cluster enables the Working Groups to deliver more impactful messages with a collective voice, enhancing their influence on key EU strategies and initiatives. The cross-sectoral perspective further fosters innovative, holistic approaches to complex challenges while enhancing collaboration.

The Strategic Cluster will also follow up on competitiveness as a priority of the new European Commission and work on defining **ERRIN's work stream tackling innovation and competitiveness** building on the work of the Innovation and Investment Working Group.

The Cluster actively monitors and engages with major EU priorities and strategies, including the Horizon Europe Programme and the upcoming Framework Programme (FP10), the development of the Multiannual Financial Framework post-2027 with a focus on the future R&I and cohesion policies and funding and their place-based dimension, as well as developments regarding interregional – or ecosystem – collaboration instruments. Additionally, the ERRIN secretariat works on the S3 Community of Practice that supports members and provides opportunities to build their regional R&I capacities through smart specialisation. <u>Exchange with MEPs: Connected regional innovation ecosystems – key for Europe's competitiveness</u>

28 January | 15:00-17:00 Policy WG In-person meeting

The critical role of research and innovation ecosystems has been recently highlighted by the Draghi and Heitor reports. Neither of the reports, however, addresses the importance of regions and their role as facilitators of those ecosystems and the collaboration that they foster across Europe as a key component of Europe's competitiveness. Innovation is deeply rooted in places — their needs and potential, including human capital. Collaboration among those ecosystems enables European regions to leverage their combined strengths, tap into each other's capacities and collaborate along value chains. Well-connected and less fragmented European innovation ecosystem is essential for enhancing the competitiveness of Europe — its resilience and strategic autonomy.

Research and innovation ecosystems embedded into regions and cities are drivers of Europe's economic development, as well as Europe's connection to citizens, ensuring they remain at the heart of the European project. Ensuring that Europe's investments are strategic and sufficiently targeted, requires understanding of the key role that regions and their ecosystems play in innovation and competitiveness. At the same time, draft proposals for radical simplification of Europe's long-term budget, the Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF), raise questions on how Europe can maintain its links with regions as engines of EU's competitiveness.

The objective of this roundtable is to discuss the role that collaboration between regions and their ecosystems plays in Europe's competitiveness, and how this role can be strengthened in the next Multiannual Financial Framework.

Towards a Union of Skills: what can regions expect?

After concluding the Year of Skills in April 2024, the European Commission announced the Union of Skills as one of the new initiatives for its first 100 days. This initiative aims to address Europe's needs for a radical change in ambition and action for all skill levels and for all types of training and education.



With the announced Union of Skills, the EU will step up and reorient skills funding in the EU budget to ensure that it is better aligned with labour markets and more focused on sectors crucial for the twin transition.

This meeting will inform the membership about the key aspects of the Union of Skills, which will focus on (1) embedding lifelong learning in education and careers and supporting teachers' training and career prospects; (2) improving basic skills and a strategic plan for STEM education, and the launch of proposals for a (3) European strategy for vocational education and training and for (4) the transferability of skills. Additionally, the event aims to provide insights into the regional dimension in this initiative and the reorientation for the skills funding that is envisaged. The meeting will provide a dialogue with the European Commission, in which members can bring their regional needs to discussion (among which the learnings from the regional skills ecosystems case studies ERRIN conducted in the CHARTER project).

Regional Innovation Valleys: lessons learned and next calls (information session incl. matchmaking)

This meeting will focus on the upcoming call for proposals 'Implementing co-funded action plans for connected regional innovation valleys' (HORIZON-EIE-2025-02-CONNECT-02), featuring a discussion around key elements of the call and a matchmaking activity. The call refers to one of the key initiatives under the Flagship 3 of the New European Innovation Agenda and should be open from 14 May to 15 October 2025.

Members will also benefit from feedback from Regional Innovation Valleys projects selected under the first Horizon Europe RIV call that ran in 2023, as well as inputs from the European Commission.

Workshop on the use of cohesion funds by research institutions – challenges and opportunities for the future (organised in collaboration with YERUN)

This joint SEFS/S3 Working Group meeting, organised with the support of the Young European Research Universities Network (YERUN), aims to gain a better of understanding of the added value of cohesion funding for research institutions, more specifically how they can contribute or accelerate the development of regional innovation ecosystems. The meeting will be organised as an informative and interactive meeting three objectives. First, to inform the ERRIN and YERUN membership about evidence already collected about the use of the cohesion funds. Second, to contrast the figures with



regional practices from across Europe giving the universities and regions an opportunity to pitch regional practices, highlighting success and challenges faced. And finally, to open the dialogue between regions and universities, for better understanding of the added value and the challenges research institutions face in using cohesion funds. The event aims to provide some practical recommendations on how the future cohesion policy could better respond to the needs of the R&I sector and how stakeholder engagement could be improved in the development of national programmes.

How can fourth generation universities take up a transformative role for delivering innovation and impact for regions?

Many theoretical frameworks have been developed to measure the regional innovation impact of universities, aiming at analysing the socioeconomic impact that universities in Europe have on their hometowns, metropolitan areas and regions. Several new concepts have emerged over the last decade, subsequently being replaced by others, like civic universities or ERA Hubs. In recent years, the concept of "4th generation universities" has gained traction within research and (higher) education policy circles. Lately, however, closer attention is being paid to its implications for regional innovation policy, given the unique and multi-faceted roles that universities play within their local ecosystems, at



the interface between industry, governments and society at large. At the same time, governments, industries and other stakeholders are increasingly calling upon universities to showcase their societal contributions. These organisations face tangible challenges that necessitate the appropriate talent and knowledge to generate solutions.

In this SEFS Working Group meeting, the concept of fourth generation universities will be presented, along with some regional cases that are implementing it.

European Innovation Act

The European Innovation Act is expected to be proposed by the Commission in the last quarter of 2025 and aims to simplify and streamline EU regulatory framework, facilitate access to venture capital and support the testing of new solutions and technologies. It will promote the access of innovative companies to European research and technology infrastructures, intellectual assets generated by publicly funded R&I in view of increasing patenting, and regulatory sandboxes allowing innovators to develop and test new ideas. This meeting will explore the role of regional dimension in this context, as well as explore how the Innovation Act links with the EU Start-Up and Scale-Up Strategy.

Early career researchers – Capacity Building Workshop Horizon Europe for newcomers

This second edition of the Horizon Europe Proposal Workshop focusses on capacity building for newcomers to the programme interested in applying for Horizon Europe's Pillar 2. During a hands-on and interactive workshop participants will learn about proposal preparation for collaborative research calls in Horizon Europe. A Horizon Europe evaluator will share practical insights, do's and don'ts from an evaluators' perspective, and some successful applicants will share their experience. Participants will also learn about ERRIN's Project Development Tool for targeted partner searches and consortium building within the wide ERRIN network of R&I stakeholders coming from 120 regions in 22 European countries. The workshop targets scientists, research managers, public administrators and other stakeholders involved in regional innovation ecosystems. There will be an additional session on the ERA Action on Early Career Researchers to highlight the opportunities available to ECRs and for this information to be cascaded to colleagues of those who attend the event. The SEFS Working Group will be in contact with UAS4Europe to examine whether we collaborate again.


