project selection, management, communication, dissemination and exploitation of results, to monitoring, auditing and governance. With a view to avoiding overlaps and duplication and increasing the leverage of Union funding, transfers from other Union programmes to Horizon Europe activities can take place. In such cases they will follow Horizon Europe rules.

Article 11 - Complementary and combined funding. Actions awarded a Seal of

Excellence certification, or which comply with the following cumulative, comparative, conditions: (a) they have been assessed in a call for proposals under the Programme; (b) they comply with the minimum quality requirements of that call for proposals; (c) they may not be financed under that call for proposals due to budgetary constraints, may receive support from the European Regional

Development Fund, the Cohesion Fund, the

European Social Fund+ or the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development, in accordance with paragraph 5 of Article [67] of Regulation (EU) XX [Common Provisions and the excellent science/innovation/development funded by the framework programme.

The rules for different funding programmes should be simplified and harmonised so as to create possibilities for synergies between programmes.

In the Cohesion policy proposal, the provision enabling Members States and regions to transfer up to 5% of their Cohesion Funds to other EU programmes such as Horizon Europe is a positive step forward. How the 5% is going to be used and through what mechanism is an important future discussion to secure links and synergies between the two funds.

ERRIN further welcomes the Commission proposal for a targeted amendment of the Enabling Regulation (COM(2018) 398/2). It will enable the Commission to make targeted modifications of current State aid rules so that national money – including from the European Structural and Investment Fund managed at national level – and EU funds managed centrally by the Commission can be combined as seamlessly

Preamble (38)	As there has been no pilot for missions, ERRIN agrees that it is important to keep future missions flexible. Solutions proposed to missions should be bottom-up and support the linking of regional innovation ecosystems from various parts of Europe and beyond. ERRIN would also like to emphasise the need to take stock of lessons learnt from "mission-like" initiatives within the framework programme such as EIPs and JTIs.
