

Background:

The project RAINMAN is funded by the Interreg CENTRAL EUROPE Programme that encourages cooperation on shared challenges in central Europe and is supported under the European Regional Development Fund.

Partners from six countries jointly developed new tools and collected methods to reduce fatalities and damages. These were tested in real-life conditions and compiled in the online platform RAINMAN-Toolbox. The aim of RAINMAN is to support local and regional administrations by providing guidance and best practice examples for the integrated reduction of heavy rain risks in Central Europe. Therefore, the RAINMAN consortium develops transferable tools and methods that will be compiled in the RAINMAN-Toolbox. The toolbox will be publicly available on a website from mid 2020.
