


In HuMUS, we focus on participatory Soil governance

- Municipal initiative.
- Agricultural companies, school canteens, processing and catering companies, associations
- Assessment of university and research centre
- Multi-stakeholder approach Quadruple Helix
- Meetings, focus groups, thematic forums, visits and exchange of information...
- Re-designing the agricultural and food system.

The Call funded actions



A. Development and implementation of effective **participatory processes** to enable and stimulate dialogues on soil health and sustainable land management at local and/or regional level;

- B. Development of **engagement and awareness raising actions** on soil health among local and regional authorities contributing to the development of soil innovation ecosystems;
- C. Drafting of **regional or local action plans** to integrate the improvement of soil health in policies and programmes, on the basis of any good practice example identified in other EU countries and regions.

The Call outputs



- 1. A signed **Territorial Management Agreement**, aimed at the sustainable management of soil health issues or threats in the local or regional community of election;
- 2. An **Analysis of Replication Potential**, evaluating the likelihood and feasibility of replicating the adopted approach in a different context and/or scale;
- **3.** A **Short Final Report**, consisting in a description of the activities done and the results achieved during the Pilot Project's lifetime (max 12 months).
