



Other aspects further tan R&I...



- The inclusion of gender perspectives will enable better quality and higher societal relevance of research and innovation activities.
- Interdisciplinarity and inclusion of Social Sciences and Humanities (SSH) aspects is a
 prerequisite for addressing a number of societal challenges, which are cross-cutting by
 nature and should be actively implemented throughout the whole research programme.
- The mainstreaming of open science across activities will increase efficiency, quality, reliability and creativity of research and innovation, enhance transparency and relevance and enable dissemination of results.
- Dissemination and exploitation of results will be supported through targeted support actions to reach relevant stakeholders.
- Circulation of knowledge between research, industry, education and training, and the balance between research and innovation, is ensured throughout the design of Horizon Europe activities.
- Key enabling technologies will be supported to enhance Europe's competitiveness in strategic value chains.



Connecting to citizens: Missions will relate EU's research and innovation to society and citizens' needs, with strong visibility and impact

A mission will consist of a portfolio of actions intended to achieve a bold and inspirational as well as measurable goal within a set timeframe, with impact for science and technology, society and citizens that goes beyond individual actions.

Horizon Europe proposal defines mission characteristics and criteria

Specific missions will be **co-designed with Member States**, **stakeholders and citizens** and programmed within the Global Challenges and Industrial Competitiveness pillar (drawing on inputs from other pillars)

About 10% Budget of Pillar-II will be devoted to Missions + MMSS contributions & other programmes, initiatives or sources!

- 1. Adaptation to Climate Change: support at least 150 European regions and communities become climate resilient by 2030 .
- 2. <u>Cancer: working with Europe's Beating Cancer Plan to improve the lives of more than 3 people by 2030 through prevention, cure and solutions to live longer and better </u>
- 3. Restore our Ocean and Waters by 2030 @
- 4. 100 Climate-Neutral and Smart Cities by 2030 @
- 5. A Soil Deal for Europe: 100 living labs and lighthouses to lead the transition towards hereby 2030



THE MISSION 'A SOIL DEAL FOR EUROPE' EXPLAINED

Missions are a novelty of the EU research and innovation programme, Horizon Europe. They are a new way of bringing concrete solutions to some of our greatest challenges. Restoring and maintaining soil health is one of these major societal challenges.

Life on Earth depends on healthy soils. Soils are not only the foundation of our food systems. They also provide clean water and habitats for biodiversity while contributing to climate resilience.

Although we take soils for granted, they are a scarce, threatened resource. It is estimated that between 60 and 70% of EU soils are unhealthy. Indeed, one centimeter of soil can take hundreds of years to form, but can be lost in just a single rainstorm or industrial incident.


the transition towards healthy soils by 2030 by putting in place an effective network of

100 living labs and lighthouses in rural and urban areas. In addition to creating knowledge and solutions for soil health, the Mission will advance the development of a harmonised framework for soil monitoring in Europe and increase people's awareness on the vital importance of soils.

The Mission is firmly embedded in the wider EU policy frameworks: it will contribute to Europe's ambition to become the first climate-neutral continent by 2050 and is an integral part of a number of Green Deal strategies². Together with the EU Soil Strategy and the recently launched European Soil Observatory (EUSO), the Mission will carry out comprehensive actions for sustainable soil management and soil restoration across a range of land uses (e.g. agriculture, forestry, urban areas, natural/semi-natural areas). The Mission will be implemented in synergy with the Common The Mission 'A Soil Deal for Europe' will support Agricultural Policy (CAP) to increase the uptake and the effectiveness of soil related measures funded under the CAP.





WHAT IS THE EU MISSION: A SOIL DEAL FOR EUROPE

The Mission 'A Soil Deal for Europe' is an ambitious, innovative instrument launched in 2021' by the European Commission to accelerate the development and large-scale deployment of solutions for sustainable land and soil management as part of a wider, green transition. Together with the Soil Strategy, the upcoming Soil Health Law, the EU Soil Observatory and climate policies (such as for carbon farming) the Mission is part of a robust framework for soil protection in the EU.

While rooted in the EU research and innovation programme, Horizon Europe, the Mission serves as a mechanism to enhance synergies with other EU programmes such as the Common Agricultural Policy and to team up with stakeholders in Member States, EU Associated Countries and global partners.

- Under discussion (also taking account administrative practicability): Joint topics with Missions
- Cancer: aspects of soil pollution, exposure pathways and impact on human health

European Mission Soil Week

Leading the transition towards healthy soils

The European Mission Soil Week is an annual event aimed at promoting the Horizon Europe Mission 'A Soil Deal for Europe' (Mission Soil) raising awareness about the importance of soil health, and driving action to protect and restore our soils.

The European Mission Soil Week, organised by the European Commission, Directorate-General for Agriculture and Rural Development (DG AGRI) in the context of the Mission Soil together with the EU funded project PREPSOIL and the Joint Research Centre - EU Soil Observatory (EUSO) will be held from 21 to 23 November 2023. The conference will be locally hosted by INIA-CSIC at the central facilities of the Spanish National Research Council (CSIC) in Madrid, Spain, under the Spanish Presidency of the EU Council.

The European Mission Soil Week is a major European gathering that brings together the European soil community. Researchers, policymakers, farmers, foresters, spatial planners, landowners and land managers, businesses, and organisations as well as the general public will meet to discuss the challenges for making and keeping EU soils healthy.

The event will be an opportunity to communicate and disseminate solutions based on the latest research results and innovations for healthy soils. Therefore, the European Mission Soil Week will bring together and mobilise communities to protect and restore soil health.

This first edition of the European Mission Soil Week is particularly significant in the context of the proposed EU Directive on Soil Monitoring and Resilience. The Commission's proposal was published on 5 July 2023 with the aim to ensure healthy soils by 2050, in close connection with the Mission Soil goals and the support the Mission can provide to reach the objectives promoted by the Directive.
