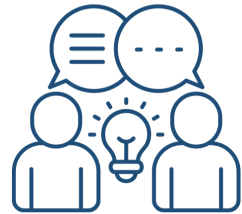




A successful NEB Initiative

OBJECTIVES

Facilitating access to financial resources for the **regeneration of public and private spaces**.

Imposing the NEB concept across various policies and projects to **drive a comprehensive change in citizens' mindsets towards sustainability and inclusivity**.



Aligning NEB principles and actions with the European Green Deal to drive local actions towards meeting sustainability targets.

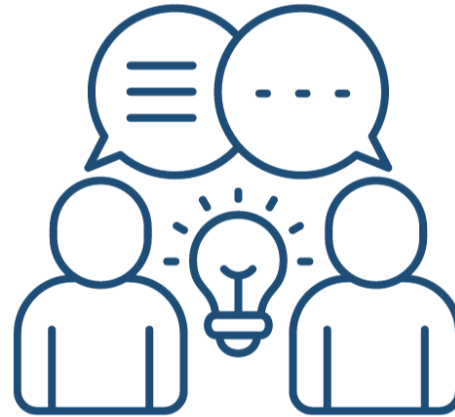
RECOMMENDATIONS:

Setting the NEB facility's priorities



leveraging their front-line insights into local challenges and opportunities.

Enhanced communication efforts



Be active players in the implementation phase, serving as demonstration sites/test beds

Function as **facilitators** providing



essential financial and political support



fostering cross-sectoral collaborations.

NEB pilot project with 15 local entities focused on capacity building, urban regeneration, and cultural transformation

BAUHAUS EUROACE VILLAGES: sustainable development in the context of rural villages





Funding & Financing

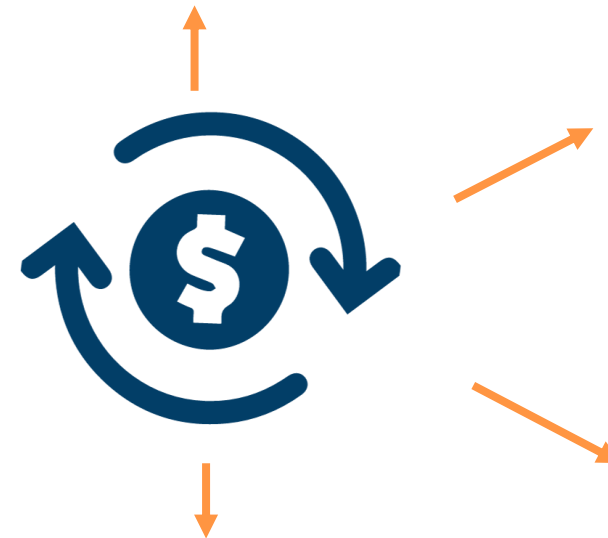
RECOMMENDATIONS:

Foster collaborations within local businesses, governmental agencies, and other organisations

Develop a **micro-grant system** to fund smaller, community-based initiatives

Support the creation of **dedicated pools of local funding** specifically for mission-related projects

Allow for **allocation adjustments** based on the evolving need



Avoid overly strict criteria in funding call texts

Introduce **mechanisms** for community members to invest in local projects

with existing Horizon
Europe (HE) Missions



Explore **synergies** with
existing HE Missions
and initiatives



Explore the option of "**cross-
Mission**" funding through
additional joint calls under HE.

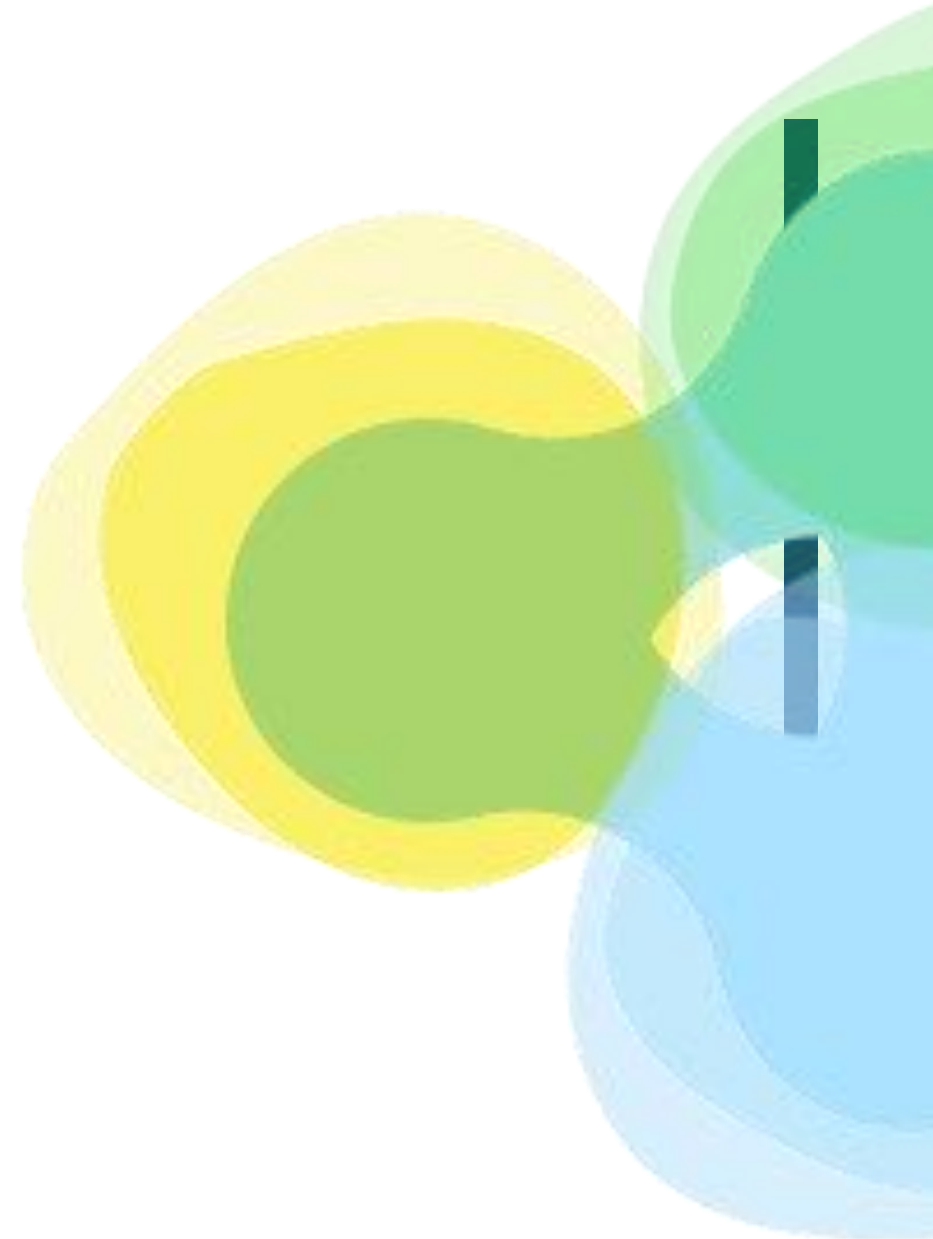
